



CAMPUS SAFETY AND SECURITY AND FIRE SAFETY REPORT for the 2016-17 school year

CAMPUS SECURITY

At Shasta Bible College, we are dedicated to providing a safe campus for our student, staff and visitors. If you are aware of any of the following items, please be diligent in reporting them immediately.

Reporting Emergencies: You should report criminal activities in progress or other emergencies including fire by calling 9 1 1.

Report campus crimes or any breach in safety or security to the Dean of Students. If you reside on-campus and the Dean of Students is not available, contact your Resident Assistant. If you reside off-campus and the Dean of Students is not available, report the above items to Dr. Nicholas. A report of all crimes submitted on campus must be made to the Campus Safety Personnel (Mrs. Iles) as soon as possible.

A Crime Analyst from the Redding Police Department has provided statistics for the information required in this report in addition to statistics compiled by the Campus Safety Personnel (Mrs. Iles). HATE MOTIVATED CRIMES

A hate motivated crime is defined as any criminal act or attempted criminal act intended to cause physical injury, emotional suffering or property damage that is, or appears to be motivated, all or in part by race, ethnic background, national origin, religious belief, sex, age, disability, or sexual orientation. A hate motivated incident is defined as any non-criminal act directed at any person or group base upon any of the eight categories listed above.

Shasta Bible College's standard of conduct is higher than that of the federal or state government. ANY act of hate, not just the eight categories as listed above is inconsistent with the 'responsibility' to live an "exemplary Christian life in keeping with the admonitions of Scripture," All hate motivated crimes are to be reported to local law enforcement as well as Campus Safety Personnel (Mrs. Iles) .

CRIME PREVENTION

- Look out for one another.
- Be aware. Report suspicious activity immediately.
- Walk in well lit areas: avoid dark areas.
- Walk in groups of two or more, especially at night.
- Always lock your vehicle and apartment.
- Report missing keys immediately.
- Always make sure your keys are in your hand, well before you reach your vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables in plain sight in your vehicle or apartment.
- Mark your personal property with your drivers' license number.
- Last person leaving a building to check if locked. If unable to lock, report immediately as needed.
- Observe internet safety. Do not reveal confidential information which could compromise your safety.
- Review and keep curfew and dating standards as required.
- Do not leave bicycles unlocked. Keep them in your dorm.
- Always lock your car on campus.

MISSING STUDENT NOTIFICATION

If a student has been missing for 24 hours, you are to report it to the Dean of Students Office and/or Dr. David Nicholas, President. If circumstances warrant, you are asked to report the missing person sooner. The Dean will call local police.

Each student living in an on-campus housing facility has the option to register a confidential contact person to be notified in the case that a student is determined to be missing. Only authorized campus officials and law enforcement officers in furtherance of a missing person investigation may have access to this information. The local law enforcement will be notified that any student is missing, even if they have not registered a contact person. Any student is missing and less than 18 years of age and not emancipated will have their parent or guardian notified.

FIRE SAFETY

For fire emergency dial 911. Be fire safe and observe your surroundings. Smoke detectors are located in all residence in the great rooms. Report all fires to your Resident Assistant. Report unintentional fires whether from cooking, smoking materials, open flames, electrical, heating equipment, hazardous products, machinery/industrial, natural or other.

Shasta Bible College is inspected annually by the Redding Fire Department. We did not administer a fire drill last year. Fire drills will be administered at least once during each semester.

Fire alarms that sound during classroom time, whether a fire drill or actual emergency, signal an emergency evacuation as instructed by the professor.

Evacuation maps are located on the hallway walls. Should an evacuation be necessary, all students are to meet in the school parking lot. If the parking lot is not safe, the second evacuation location is the ball field at Crosspointe Community Church.

For the purposes of fire safety report, a fire is: "Any instance of open flame or other burning in a place not intended to contain the burning or in an uncontrolled manner".

All FIRES AND CRIMES must be reported with the appropriate form to the Campus Safety Person—Mrs. Iles
