Master of Divinity degree in Military Chaplaincy prepares you to become a military chaplain or servant leader. The M.Div. program trains students to be wise, faithful stewards of the gospel, and develop specific ministry skills, strategies, and Christian character traits necessary for successful ministry as a military chaplain. This program examines the theological and cultural issues relevant for formal and informal chaplaincy positions.

PROGRAM OFFERINGS

- Military Chaplaincy Traditional Track (96 Units)
This track complies with the chaplaincy requirements for military chaplains traditionally recommended by ecclesiastical endorsing agencies.
- Military Chaplaincy Basic Track (72 Units)
This track complies with the basic chaplaincy requirements for military chaplains set by the Department of Defense.

TRANSFER INFORMATION

- Transfer credit is evaluated on the following criteria and must come from official transcripts requested by the student:
- Graduate transfer credit must come from an accredited institution
- Evaluations are done by the registrar's office once the application to the program has been completed and transcripts have been received.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS

- Complete Application Process for SBC&GS
- The student must have a bachelor's degree.
- A cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 (2.5 allows provisional admission for the first 12 units in the program).
